6.	 1. Primary Care Framework – Place Based Plan (PBP): SA updated the Locality on the positive patient engagement event held recently at the Littlebury Hotel. The feedback was positive with agreement around urgent access hubs, early visiting service and care closer to home. The meeting was also attended by a number of patients from Upper Heyford who are keen to see GP services situated on this new housing development. SA confirmed there was an email out to Bicester practices to see if there is interest in providing a branch surgery on this site. Positive feedback on the Alchester practice model- a number of attendees felt this was an improved service for all. 	
	The plans are now published in draft form on the CCG website and are still available for comment. They have an extra section which includes	1

the feedback from the patient engagement event.	
LS felt the plan missed an opportunity to discuss health services for young people as it focused on the growing, older population. This was acknowledged along with the need for more LD input, and to ensure the findings from the Bicester JSNA profile were included.	SA
Bicester JSNA profile: JAH asked for any comments to be fed back as this JSNA gives the Locality and CCG an opportunity to plan local health services more effectively. SA drew everyone's attention to the changing demographic and how the older population will put pressure on GP services. There are some pockets of deprivation, and depression was high in some areas. Winter Planning update: LS gave detailed plans of how the Federation will be supporting the winter planning in the NE. It was acknowledged with so many different models being offered to patients for appointments it could be difficult to understand. LS requested practices make use of the Sunday appointments.	ALL
JD asked practices not to use the NHSe Poster for GP access over the Xmas period as it does not fully reflect the full Oxfordshire offer. This is being re-written and will be out soon. JD confirmed an extra 500 GP appointments will be available over the Xmas/NY period.	Note
LS stated the Early Visiting service has had its capacity increased using slippage monies from earlier under spends. With an additional 2 ECP to increase flexibility and capacity. Staffing will be available throughout Xmas/NY period. This service works well in the NE and JD will be sending a letter to the LCD's to confirm recurrent funding potentially till March 2020. Giving this contract over 3 years will increase stability.	Note
The Locality would like an up to date position on Xmas holiday staffing from ONEMed. ACTION: LS to circulate.	LS
LS confirmed the service has been running for 3 years with a stable GP locum workforce. The Fed would like the locums to convert to permanent contracts; unfortunately this is not yet an attractive option.

15.	Audiology – AQP (any qualified provider) – self referral SA gave a brief context around this area. Patients have always needed to have a-GP direct referral before they can be seen at the OUHFT for hearing aids and this applies equally currently to local AQP providers. The LMC suggests that patients could self refer for hearing aids ithat AQP could refer patients direct, to save GP time. It was queried does GP involvement add value to this process. The general feeling was the GP didn't generally add sufficient value to the process unless there was other pathology. Most felt a self-referral was entirely appropriate with providers clearing ear wax and referring back to GPs patients who have a hearing problem other than age related hearing loss. and SA will forward the views of the Locality. The Locality would be interested to know the cost implication of an AQP service for audiology.	SA
