### Executive Summary

#### West Berkshire Locality Management Team

The Newbury and District Locality covers the majority of the West Berkshire local authority area. The management team, at a recent review of the terms of reference, resolved to name themselves after the local authority area in recognition of the geography of the partnerships at locality level.

Interim changes to the ICS management team have impacted on the makeup of the West Berkshire Locality Management Team (LMT).

Shairoz Claridge has stepped away from the locality and now has a BOB-wide role as Interim Director Lead for Long Term Conditions in addition to her role as Director of Operations Berkshire West CCG for Planned Care and Long-Term Conditions. Shairoz first joined the locality in October 2014 and has overseen the development of key integration projects with the local authority alongside the establishment of Primary Care Networks. The thanks of all the management team are owed to Shairoz who has built strong relationships with partners and a strong primary care voice.

Katie Summers has joined the LMT in her new role as Berkshire West ICP Interim Director for Place-Based Partnerships.

Carolyn Gregory, Locality Administrator, is leaving the CCG for a role as PCN Manager for the A34 Primary Care Network. ### West Berkshire Vaccination Take-up

Over 85% of the adult population of West Berkshire had received at least one COVID vaccination dose by 5<sup>th</sup> August 2021. The table below shows take-up by age decile as of 5<sup>th</sup> August 2021 in West Berkshire compared with that across the BOB.

We have reported uptake at a local authority level on a fortnightly basis, with a focus on clinically high-risk groups, ethnicity, and areas of deprivation. Thirteen walk-in clinics have been facilitated by the Locality Manager in conjunction with partners and local communities to support wards and patient groups with lower take up than the rest of the West Berkshire population

### Local Integration Board

The membership of the local integration board includes the CCG, NHS trusts, PCNs, West Berkshire Council, Healthwatch, and the voluntary sector. The board is co-chaired by Katie Summers and Paul Coe, Service Director for Adult Social Care at WBC.

The LIB continues to focus on the three priorities chosen for its Work Programme for 2021/22:

1. MDT development – a long standing ambition of the LIB has been to develop MDTs into an even more proactive case management way of working. This work continues to be a key focus for the LIB and Dr Richard Rudgley, Clinical Director for Kennet PCN, has been identified as the SRO for this workstream. A set of shared practice-level principles for effective MDTs has been developed with targeted work to support practices where required.

2. Mental Health –Mike Harling, Principal Social Worker in Adult Social Care – WBC, has been identified as the SRO for this workstream and has proposed a light-touch approach is required to join up and promote existing work to support patients with anxiety and depression.

3. Personalisation/ patient activation – an audit of activity against the personalised care model is proposed and it is likely this workstream will be joined up to mental health due to large areas of overlap.

### Wokingham Locality Management Team

Interim changes to the ICS management team have impacted on some of the roles of members of the Wokingham Locality Management Team (LMT). Katie Summers now has responsibility for the three locality areas in Berkshire West in her new role as Berkshire West ICP Interim Director for Place-Based Partnerships. Katie is now also the Vaccination Lead for Berkshire West, covering both the Covid-16 and flu vaccination programmes

### Wokingham Vaccination Take-up

86.3% of the over 16 population of Wokingham had received at least one COVID vaccination dose by 28<sup>th</sup> August 2021. The table below shows take-up by age decile as of 12th August 2021 in Wokingham compared with that across the BOB ICS.

We have reported uptake at a local authority level on a fortnightly basis, with a focus on clinically high-risk groups, ethnicity, and areas of deprivation. Several walk-in clinics using the Health of the Move Van have been run in conjunction with partners and local communities to support wards and patient groups with lower take up than the rest of the Wokingham population. Sites visited include Bulmershe school, Asda Lower Earley and Norrlys.
