Purpose and summary of paper:

Unfortunately OCCG still haven't been able to recruit a Diabetes Locality Co-ordinator from the North locality. The job description is overleaf.

OCCG have expanded this to also cover practice nurses if one was willing but unfortunately no-one has come forward.

We now have 5 of the 7 positions filled (2 in Oxford City) and are keen to get someone in place in the North to support practices.

Diabetes clinical lead, Dr Amar Latif is very happy for people to contact him directly to talk things through if they wish.

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Locality Diabetes Coordinator - Oxfordshire

Oxfordshire CCG is to appoint 7 Locality Diabetes Coordinators across Oxfordshire, with two in Oxford City and one in every other locality. The coordinators will contribute to the vision and aims of the Oxfordshire Diabetes Project Board:

Provide the highest quality of care for people with diabetes across Oxfordshire

Contributing aims:

- To deliver high quality diabetes care
- To reduce variation in diabetes care
- To provide efficient and sustainable diabetes care

Description of the role

The following is a description of the main duties/responsibilities of the role:

- 1. Focus on improving diabetes treatment targets and care processes across the locality
- 2. Sharing best practice on managing diabetes patients and their care across practices in the locality, including in-practice support/advice.
- 3. Coordinating diabetes healthcare professional education for primary care. Defining the need for the locality, including the type of education. Understand how effective education is for the locality.
- 4. Identifying primary care diabetes expertise and resource within the locality and proposing/coordinating how the resource can be shared across the locality. This would include detailing any investment that may be required to facilitate this.
- 5. Develop effective working relationships with the diabetes specialist team.
- 6. Providing leadership and support for the other practice diabetes GP leads in the locality and chairing of the 6 monthly Locality Diabetes Review Meeting.
- 7. Contributing clinical focus to developing the Oxfordshire Integrated Diabetes Service and its governance/contractual development.
- 8. Be an ambassador for Year of Care Planning for diabetes care in the locality.
- 9. Provide a point of contact and liaison for OCCG's diabetes commissioners.
- 10. Identifying Type 1 patients not attending specialist clinics

The role is fixed term for one year. The time dedicated to the role will be a standard 25 sessions per year, approx. 1 session every two weeks. There will also be up to 10 flexible extra sessions available which would be used in the first 4-6 months in the role to intensify induction into the role. The post holder will provide a monthly summary report to Oxfordshire CCG commissioners as to the sessions completed and what work has been done in those sessions.

The practice will be reimbursed for time in the role at a rate of £75 per hour, which is the standard Oxfordshire CCG rate for GPs undertaking work for the CCG. The practice is to invoice Oxfordshire CCG, not the individual GP taking up the role. If a non-GP takes up the role, the practice will be reimbursed according the current practice staff grade of the coordinator.
