- A week long multi-agency focus on
 - Helping avoid admissions to HGH when the patient can go home
 - Supporting people who have been admitted to hospital move on in a timely way when they are medically fit for discharge
- Develop a daily routine that supports flow and mobilises OUH and community resources to improve outcomes for patients, families and the health and social care system
- Create learning to help HGH plan for how it deploys the new integrated hub to improve patient flow going forward
