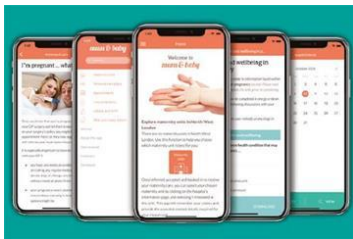


Catch it, Bin it, Kill it
