- The Long Term Plan conflates all the ambitions previously described in Better Births into a single over-riding ambition – **safety**
 - Maternity related deaths halved by 2025
 - 50% reduction in stillbirths, maternal mortality, neonatal mortality and serious brain injury

Work underway



 BOB Local Maternity System (LMS) Plan – action plan rated green by NHS England in December 2018.

- Oxfordshire LMS Plan:
 - Personalised care centred on the woman and her baby
 - Continuity of care
 - Safer care
 - Multi-professional working
 - Commissioning for personalisation, safety and choice

Key specifics



- √ Maternal medicine networks by 2019.
- √ 10 Key Maternity Safety Actions to replace CNST in 2019/20
- √ Expansion of Saving Babies Lives care bundle to include pre-term birth during 2020.
- √ Expansion of National Maternity and Neonatal Safety Collaboratives.
- √ Most women to have continuity of carer by 2021.
- √ Roll out the Perinatal Mortality Review tool
- $\sqrt{}$ By 2023/24 all women to access care notes on smart phone apps
- √ By 2023/24 expanding access to perinatal mental health care (maternity outreach clinics)

Implications and risks



- The focus on safety supports the work on reconfiguring obstetric services, however, it is a challenge for the system in terms of the public's perception of safety.
- We need to rethink our communication messages about local maternity services (childbirth is the safest it has ever been...)
- Focus in previous decade has been on normal birth, low risk pregnancies, midwifery led care → resources balanced between safety and choice?
- But progress is being made...
