Do you have a process if people do not attend?	If you have attempted to contact the person and / or their carer a minimum of three times (including a telephone call) please consider making a referral to the Oxford Health Community LD Team (CLDT) via the EMIS referral form.
	The team may be able to determine why the person is not attending and also work with you to help facilitate them to receive an AHC.
Offer a medicines review to stop over- prescribing of psychotropic medication of people with a learning disability, autism or both (NHSE STOMP & STAMP programme)?	NB: We are currently exploring whether we can have some time from Pharmacy to help with this work.
