<p>Do you have a process if people do not attend?</p>			<p>If you have attempted to contact the person and / or their carer a minimum of three times (including a telephone call) please consider making a referral to the Oxford Health Community LD Team (CLDT) via the EMIS referral form.</p> <p>The team may be able to determine why the person is not attending and also work with you to help facilitate them to receive an AHC.</p>
<p>Offer a medicines review to stop over-prescribing of psychotropic medication of people with a learning disability, autism or both (NHSE STOMP & STAMP programme)?</p>			<p>NB: We are currently exploring whether we can have some time from Pharmacy to help with this work.</p>
