

## The Combined Meds and Allergies View

The Combined Meds and Allergies view displays information on past and current medications alongside recorded allergies from General Practices.

**NB:** GP practices in Oxfordshire use one of two clinical systems. Most use a system called EMIS for which this view was designed .

A few use a system called Vision. For these patients, there are two medication views alongside two allergies views, which are entitled:

- **Medications From GP Practice**
- **Medications From Oxford University Hospitals**
- **Allergies and Contraindications From GP Practices**
- **Allergies and Contraindications From Oxford University Hospitals**

Where explanation of terms may be required, we have added information in hover boxes in the OCS.
